• **REGISTRATION**. Participants can register for any Fifth Third River Bank Run event at <u>www.53riverbankrun.com</u>. Participants can register online until April 30 and the Fifth Third River Bank Run will absorb participants' credit card processing fees (approximately \$2 per online entry). This means that it will cost no more to register online than it would by mailing in a paper entry form. 27th Annual Fifth Third River Bank Run commemorative apparel is also available for purchase online. Entry forms will be available at any Fifth Third Banking Center and Sheldon Cleaners location as of January 19. Participants can register via the mail and take advantage of early registration fees of \$23 for the 25K, \$20 for the 5K Run, \$15 for the 5K Walk and \$5 for Junior until April 23. Walk-in registration is currently available at any Gazelle Sports location.

- □ In addition to corporate-sponsored, speed teams, and military teams, clydesdale and public service divisions has been added to the Team Competition. Traditional team rules, fees and weight classes apply to participants choosing to participate on clydesdale teams. Public service team members consist of police people, firefighter and paramedics, and all Public Service team fees will be waived

2003 WINNERS RETURNING TO COMPETE IN 27th ANNUAL FIFTH THIRD RIVER BANK RUN

GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN (JANUARY 8, 2004)—Fifth Third River Bank Run officials have announced that the 2003 winners -- Dan Browne (United States) and Albina Ibanova (Russian) -- will travel to Grand Rapids to compete in the 25K race on May 8. In addition, second place finisher Joseph

Kariuki (Kenya) has also made the commitment to race on May 8. In 2003, Browne took first place with a time of 1:16:13 while Kariuki finished one second later with a time of 1:17:13. Ivanova finished first with a time of 1:27:28.

The first American since 1996 to win the Fifth Third River Bank Run, Dan Browne ran the 25K event for the first time in 2003. In addition to accomplishment in Grand Rapids, Browne's road race achievements include first place in '01 and '02 New Haven 20K (59:21) and first at the '02 Twin Cities Marathon (2:11:38).

Joseph Kariuki, who set a former 25K World record (1:13:55) on the River Bank Run course in '98, has also made the commitment to race the streets of Grand Rapids on May 8. Since setting the former 25K World record in '98, Kariuki has been back to Grand Rapids annually to attempt a repeat performance and take advantage of the \$5,000 Fifth Third World Record Bonus which has been in place since '99. Although he took first place in '99 and '00, fifth in '01, third in '02 and second in '03, Kariuki has not been able to break his own record.

Albina Ivanova's career includes a second place finish at the '02 Honolulu Marathon (2:29:53), first in '02 Dubai (2:33:31) and first in '02 and second in '01 Omsk International (2:30:21). Ivanova also took first in '02 Russian Championship 4K X-C and second in '01 Athens.

PRIZE MONEY FOR THE 5K RUN
