A teams may be strong is a meet an invitational or jamboree with less than 10 teams they still could be strong in meets with 20 or so teams but as there gets to be close to 30 teams that string out, teams with a weak 4 and or 5 runner, those runners pick up a lot of points. It is not uncommon for the 5 and/or 4 runner(s) to determine the meet. It is not uncommon for a runner that has not been in a meet this large to fall apart.

There are several races that look to be very competitive. It is not uncommon for teams that have beaten a team at last Saturday's regional or in meets during the season lose to them Saturday. That is why I call this part of the season "fun time."

Teams are awarded points according to how they finish in the invitationals they run in, 10 points for first, 9 for second and so on. Some invitationals are weighted because of the large field and there is a minimum number of teams required in order for a team to earn rating points. The numbers in parentheses indicates the first place coach's votes/first place(s) in invitational meets. The final number is the total number of points for the school, including coach's votes and invitational points. The invitational points are cumulative over the entire season, to a maximum of eight, with only one being counted each week. If a school has more that the maximum number for that week of the season, they will only receive the invitational points for the maximum allowed for that week. Total number of invitational wins will be indicated in the parenthesis. Coaches vote each week.
